EVERY Wednesday after school, during term time, we hold a group for primary age children and their parents/carers. As part of the club we get together and make crafts, have some time to play and enjoy a snack.

Recently our craft was to make a bee, because bees make honey which is sweet. We also baked some jam buns that were delicious. This got us thinking that the Bible tells us kind words are like honey - sweet to the soul and healthy for the body.

This little verse from Proverbs 16:24 has stuck with me this week. The world is not always a kind place and kind words too often seem to be in short supply. Social media is often taken up with anger, and cruel words. But a kind word really does go a long way and really does lift the soul.

I was the grateful recipient of some encouraging words recently. The words really did feel sweet as honey to me and made me feel valued and cared for. My mood lightened and my confidence grew.

Jesus often spoke kind words to the lost, the lonely and those who seemed to be hurting and broken. His words were like honey to those who heard them, and his kind words were followed by goodness too. His words of love showed people that they were valued by Him. What was true then, is true today. He wants to speak kindness into your life even today.

He wants you to know that you are loved and valued, just as you are, just where you are. So today if you feel lost, or a bit broken, remember that Jesus wants to reach out to you and that he cares for you. Why not allow His sweet words into your life?


Heavenly Father, we pray for Christian teenagers, for great wisdom and courage as they live out their faith.

Christians believe in its simplest form the Bible is a story about God and how people relate to God.

They believe the Holy Spirit inspired all the different genres,

styles, authors, and context into a unified but diverse book of books that explains the story of God, the world He created, and humanity's place in it.

A story which culminates in Jesus and what life is like lived with Him.

It can be read alone, at home, within a small group and with everybody at church. Sometimes it speaks to us directly, other times we need help to understand some of the treasures contained within its pages.

If you own a Bible, don't let it gather dust upon the bookshelf. Let it be read and re-read on a regular basis and expect the Lord to speak!



We were asked to write a word or phrase plus any artistic flare to compliment it. Folk rose to the challenge and here are some of the finished results.




