

PATRICK HOUSE, in Millbrook Road West, is a sixty six bedded intensive support hostel located in our local community for people at risk of, or have been,

rough sleeping. It caters for men and women between the ages of eighteen and sixty who often have past trauma, mental health challenges and substance misuse difficulties.

Residents can stay for up to two years with the aim of working towards more independent suitable accommodation. They are allocated a project worker who helps them to work towards their personal goals.

Residents often start their journey at Patrick House with very little money or possessions and even when they are on benefits, they still struggle to buy everything they need.
